## EDUTRAIN2 Advancing Green Skills in VET

EDUTRAIN2 was held in Herceg Novi, Montenegro, gathering 18 participants from the Western Balkans and EU partner countries to further develop green skills and sustainable entrepreneurship in vocational education. The training combined interactive workshops, collaborative exercises, and practical use of the VETERANS digital learning platform, allowing participants to test and provide feedback on the program.

### Main Highlights

- Participants explored the fundamentals of green entrepreneurship, energy efficiency, circular economy, and sustainable business practices.
- Hands-on workshops supported learners in developing and presenting their own green business ideas, applying concepts in practical scenarios.
- The VETERANS digital platform was tested in real conditions, enabling trainers and learners to provide feedback for refinement before wider rollout.
- Networking sessions and collaborative group work fostered exchange of best practices and strengthened cross-border cooperation.
- Cultural visits in Herceg Novi and Kotor added an experiential learning element, supporting team-building and appreciation of local heritage.
- Participants actively engaged in evaluation sessions, sharing insights on curriculum content, digital tools, and practical exercises to improve future training.
- Certificates will be awarded to participants who successfully complete the training and evaluation process.

EDUTRAIN2 reinforced the practical application of green skills, encouraged collaboration among VET learners and trainers, and prepared participants for the next steps of the VETERANS project, including upcoming multiplier events and further capacity-building activities.
