Main Highlights

• Project Results Dissemination

Multiplier events were successfully organized in all partner countries to present the key results, educational outputs, and objectives of the VETERANS project. In Greece, the dissemination took the form of the Final Conference, bringing together a wider audience of stakeholders.

• Blended Format: Theory and Practice

Each event combined presentations of the VETERANS curriculum, e-learning platform, and training activities with interactive workshops, allowing participants to engage directly with the project's tools and methodologies.

• Strong Stakeholder Engagement

Around 30 participants attended each multiplier event, including VET providers, educators, entrepreneurs, policy representatives, and civil society actors. The events encouraged discussion on green skills, energy, environment, and sustainable entrepreneurship.

• Visibility and Outreach

The events were supported by a comprehensive promotional campaign using the project website, social media, newsletters, email invitations, and printed materials, ensuring broad outreach and strong visibility.

• Impact and Sustainability

The multiplier events strengthened cooperation with external stakeholders, promoted the uptake of project results, and supported the long-term sustainability of the VETERANS educational program beyond the project partnership.
